They work on to revitalize rural area all over Japan and to develop human resource now. He awarded Ashoka Fellows as a social entrepreneur to lead the world in 2014.

Yachiyo EGUCHI is a registered nurse and was born in Nagano Prefecture. She started her nurse career in 1975 right after her graduation from The National Tohsei Hospital College of Nursing. She served key positions in national hospitals such as the National Children's Hospital (Tokyo), National Sakura Hospital (Chiba), National Cancer Center (Tokyo), Nishikofu Hospital (Yamanashi), National International Medical Center (Tokyo), National Shimoshizu Hospital (Chiba). She retired in March 2014 as chief nurse at Sagamihara National Hospital (Kanagawa.) In 2015, she received the Order of the Sacred Treasure, Gold and Silver Rays, *Zuiho-soko-shou*.

Family House and JHHH :

Yachiyo was involved with activities initiated by a group of mothers who temporarily staying in Tokyo and wanted accommodations for families of children with life-threatening illness when she worked as a head nurse of pediatric ward at National Cancer Center. In 1991, she began establishing Family House by collaborating with parents of cancer children, medical practitioners, and supporters. In 1993, Family House opened Kangaroo-no-ie (Kangaroo's House), the first facility in Japan. In 1999, Japan Hospital Hospitality House Network (JHHH) was established to improve information exchange and quality communication among member organizations throughout Japan and Family House become the secretariat of JHHH. In 2007, Yachiyo was appointed as chairman of Family House.

Satomi TAMADA was born in Tokyo. Graduated from Japan Women's College of Physical Education. After working as a reporter for TBS Radio, I became a broadcast writer. When my son was diagnosed profoundly deaf, I learned that sign language was prohibited in deaf schools in Japan. I supported the establishment of an NPO, Bilingual Bicultural Education Center for Deaf Children, aimed at educating deaf children in sign language.

In 2008, the only private bilingual bicultural deaf school which uses Japanese Sign Language and written Japanese for education was established. The donation for the establishment of the school was about 110 million yen collected over a short period of time. It became one of the landmark cases of an NPO collecting that much fund.

We provide services to promote the understanding and the spread of bilingual deaf education.
